Subject : Tamil Nadu Assembly Election

We submit the following **key suggestions** for your kind consideration and inclusion in your manifesto:

1. Public Transport & Urban Mobility

Suburban rail commuters travelling from Gummidipoondi towards Tiruttani are compelled to change trains at Basin Bridge, often crossing tracks unsafely. With Perambur proposed as Chennai's fourth railway terminal, additional suburban services between Tondiarpet and Tiruttani/Avadi via Vyasarpadi, along with a new station near MKB Nagar, are essential. The MRTS–CMRL merger must be expedited, and the CUMTA Comprehensive Mobility Plan and On-Street Parking Policy implemented in letter and spirit.

2. Perambur Terminal & Road Infrastructure

Upgradation of Perambur Railway Station should be accompanied by removal of encroachments and long-pending road widening on arterial BRR roads. The flawed design of the Murasoli Maran Flyover must be revisited to restore direct connectivity between Perambur and Ayanavaram.

3. Railway Safety, Accessibility & Maintenance

The unusable Perambur Loco Works Subway has forced dangerous track crossings. A foot overbridge with lifts or escalators near the booking office is urgently required. Railway tracks within city limits must be fenced, RPF strength increased, CCTV and lighting improved, and overcharging by vendors strictly curbed. Train maintenance, especially sanitation of bio-toilets, must be enforced.

4. Optimal Use of Public Infrastructure

Relocating the Perambur Post Office back into the railway station would reduce rental burden and benefit commuters. This model can be replicated across suburban and MRTS stations.

5. Environment & Sustainable Development

Enact and enforce strong laws to protect water bodies, waterways, marshlands, mangroves, trees, and natural resources such as sand and rare earths. Reconsider projects like the Marina rope car and prevent

beaches from being converted into political memorial spaces. In view of rising sea levels, encourage development in safer extended areas of Greater Chennai.

6. Governance, Economy & Social Welfare

Prioritise world-class public infrastructure, education, and healthcare over unsustainable freebies. Introduce Navodaya Schools across the State, ensure last-mile delivery of Central Government schemes, promote entrepreneurship, create warehousing facilities for farmers, and develop satellite townships with jobs and infrastructure.

7. Law & Order and Safety

Take decisive action against liquor abuse, drugs, daylight robberies, and deteriorating law and order. Strengthen enforcement and narcotics control agencies. Governments should not engage in liquor sales—TASMAC must be shut down and liquor strictly regulated. Corruption must be addressed with transparency and accountability. Traffic laws should be enforced strictly with mandatory body cameras for uniformed personnel.

8. Women's Safety & Civic Participation

Expand smart HD CCTV surveillance under the Nirbhaya Scheme, increase police presence, and construct shelters for the homeless and animals. Empower RWAs and promote citizen participation in local governance. Instilling civic sense from an early age is critical for societal transformation.

We trust these suggestions will receive due consideration while finalising the Party's manifesto.
